## Oil Painting

Oil colors: purchase the best you can afford. Grumbacher and Winsor/Newton are good. Avoid paints with "hue" or "tint", as they contain more fillers and the color impact will be diluted. (It will take more paint to get desired result)
$\square$ Titanium White-large tube
$\square$ Cadmium Yellow light

- Yellow Ochre
$\square$ Cadmium Red Light
- Alizarin Crimson
$\square$ Ultramarine Blue
$\square$ Cerulean Blue (phalo blue may be substituted)
$\square$ Sap Green
- Viridian
- Burnt Umber
$\square$ Burnt Sienna
- Black (optional)


## Brushes:

Bristle (hog's hair) filbert \#4,\#6,\#8 (flats or brights are ok)- Sable-like bristles (soft) \#2,\#4,\#6
$\square$ Additional brushes as needed

Other:

- 100\% low odor/odorless mineral spirits (paint thinner). Get at the hardware store.
$\square$ Large mayo sized jar with lid
$\square \quad$ Paper towels (Viva is good)
$\square$ Oil painting medium (don't get fast or slow drying medium)
$\square$ Refined linseed oil
$\square$ Palette - not white (a piece of glass with a piece of cardboard taped underneath is good)
$\square$ Palette knife - trowel shaped metal
$\square$ Cotton swabs
Bring an apron, old shirt or wear clothes you don't mind getting paint on


## Canvas:

- New, pre-stretched canvas $11 \times 14-16 \times 20$
